2011 Lunch and Lecture Series

The 2011 Lunch and Lecture was off to a wonderful start with a tour of the Bayville Historical Museum followed by a book signing, lunch and lecture by noted author and lecturer on maritime history, Adam Grohman.

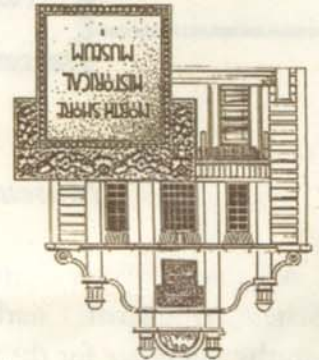
Museum receives \$125,000 Grant

A Capital Projects Grant of \$125,000 has been received by the Museum. State Assemblyman Charles Lavine initially designated the Museum as a worthy candidate for the Grant and the Museum followed through by filing the necessary applications and documents with the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York, the administrators of the grant.

The Grant was fully executed on April 21, 2011. Museum President Brian Mercadante said, "This grant could not have come at a better time. We'd certainly like to thank the state of New York and Assemblyman Lavine for their recognition of our Museum. Now that we've completed the exterior restoration of our new home the historic Justices Court Building in Glen Cove, work has begun on the interior and these funds will help us bring our work to completion."

The new grant will also be used as the matching share of the \$150,000 grant the Museum received in 2009 from the New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation. The Museum will contribute the additional \$25,000 to match the earlier grant which will be garnered from Museum contributions.

When completed visitors will be able to see this historic building as it appeared in the early 20th century. It will be a home that will display the historical artifacts and archives related to North Shore and Gold Coast history. It will house oral histories gathered from the memories of long time residents. It will also be a home that will make the City of Glen Cove a must see destination for all those interested in this unique history.
