Celebrating Italian Immigration

Oct 6, 2024 - Feb 15, 2025

About the Exhibition

Between 1890 and 1920, about 25 million immigrants came to the United States. Most stayed near their ports of arrival - New York (including Glen Cove), Boston, and Philadelphia, with some moving to the Midwest and father west.

()

Whereas immigrants in the 19th century had chiefly been Irish, German, and Chinese, in the 1840s and 1850s, the "new immigrants" came mainly from eastern and southern Europe, including Italy. According to the 1910 census, the population of Glen Cove was about 10,000, with about 20% of those of Italian backgrounds. It was determined that by then, immigrants and their children made up about half of the U.S. population.

Many Italians came over from the towns of Sturno and Frigento starting in the late 1890s and settled in Glen Cove. These immigrants formed a strong community and became an important part of the fabric of Glen Cove. This exhibition celebrates these families and their contributions to the local community.

Learn about the Orchard!

The earliest Italians to settle in Glen cove settled in an area called the Orchard which is the wedge shaped neighborhood bounded by Cedar Swamp Road, Sea Cliff Avenue, the LIRR tracks and Route 107 (Glen Cove Road). The area was originally an apple orchard from which its' name derives. It is a small area made up of a few streets, two now named for the Glen Cove Italians who lost their lives in WWI: Aniello Stanco and Luigi Capobianco).


A key part of the Orchard was The Orchard house which was generously funded by Mrs. Florence Gibb Pratt of the Glen Cove Pratt family. This community center was built to aid the needs of the Italian community in Glen Cove with a library, a hall for sports and classrooms offering citizenship classes. It also housed celebrations and Sunday masses led by Italian Speaking Priests in a wooden chapel named La Capella. As many prospered, they built homes across Cedar Swamp Road on 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and Wolfe Streets, a section that became known as the upper Orchard.

...FROM THE PAST TO THE PRESENT...

The movement that brought Italian immigrants to America ca. 1890-1920 was part of a "new migration" that Italians referred to as "The Great Arrival." In that 30-year period, approximately 4 million Italian immigrants came to the U.S., about half between 1900 and 1910. For them, America represented a "land of opportunity," a chance for new freedom and a fresh start.

The major question became how this country would greet them. On the one hand, the Statue of Liberty symbolically welcomed them with open arms. On the other hand, many were reluctant to accept them as "Americans": they were generally poor, illiterate, and Catholic. Those citizens who had realized success were not always ready to encourage or enhance the immigrants' chances to realize the same success. Finding life in America less promising than expected and missing family and friends, within 5 years, 40% to 50% of the Italian immigrants returned to Italy.

However, those who stayed established themselves and their cultural customs and values and have made significant contributions to American society.

This exhibit focuses on the Italian population of Glen Cove which, for over 100 years, has been a rich and essential part of the city's history.




During World War II, they kept records of parishioners who served their country in the Armed Forces and built a monument called the "Service Roll" in their honor.






